



# **General Rules**

All competitors taking part must be members of the Young Farmers Association before 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2022 and they must also be under 28 years of age on the day of the Rally, unless otherwise specified

## Entries

The closing date of all club entries is **Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> June 2022**. The committee asks that when completing the entry form that your club does its best to keep it as accurate as possible. An entry form is enclosed and **it should be noted that late entries will not be accepted**.

## **Entry Fee**

The Club entry fees are as follows:	31 or more members	£60
	30 or less members	£40

Clubs will be notified of fee owing **following** the Rally when final membership numbers are confirmed. **Please do not send a cheque with your entry form**.

## Rules

Should any controversy arise regarding competitions or the application of rules, the decision of the Rally Committee or Chairman is final.

In the instance of joint places, the points for that place and the places following will be added together and divided by the number of joint places, so that each club has the same amount of points. For example: Three clubs are joint 2<sup>nd</sup>, the points awarded for 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> will be added together and divided by three. Points will then be issued for 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> place where required.

# NOTE: NO MEMBERS MAY COMPETE FOR TWO CLUBS IN ANY OF THE RALLY COMPETITIONS; OTHERWISE, BOTH CLUBS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED WITHOUT WARNING

# Construction

The Practical Competition will have an additional entry fee which will be confirmed as soon as possible. Competitors will be notified of the Construction Plan on the morning of the rally.

#### **Trophy Points**

The maximum entries per club per contest are stated in the rules. In the instance of joint first any trophies / overall trophy the Club with the most firsts would win.

#### **Raffle Tickets**

Raffle ticket sales will be included as a section in the rally competitions; therefore, will offer an additional opportunity for clubs to gain points towards the **Overall Rally trophies**, the Caroline Rennie Rose Bowl and the Turriff JAC Perpetual Challenge Trophy for Small Clubs. Points will be awarded based on the percentage of tickets sold in proportion to the number allocated to the club. Clubs will be allocated five Raffle Tickets per member. All money and surplus tickets must be returned to the **Raffle Convenor on 18<sup>th</sup> June <u>before</u> midday** for the points to be awarded as follows:

Any club who sells less than 50% of their raffle books will have to forfeit 10 points and any missing raffle tickets must be paid.

# <u>STOCKJUDGING</u>

## Classes :

Competitors will be required to judge eight classes along with a valuation class. Details of classes will be confirmed prior to the rally.

Class 1 Dairy	Class 4 Beef	Class 7 Sheep
Class 2 Beef	Class 5 Sheep	Class 8 Valuation
Class 3 Beef	Class 6 Sheep	

#### Teams:

A team shall consist of 3 members, one of which can be an associate member (between the ages of 28 & 30). A maximum of 2 teams per Club may enter. Any competitor seen near the stock before the competition commences or with any person other than an official during the competition will be disqualified.

#### Time:

Competitors will report to Stockjudging Master Scorers **at the showfield at 8.30am** prompt. Any team who does not have their cards by **9.15am** will be disqualified. On commencing, 7 minutes will be allowed for competitors to observe each of the animals, 1 minute will be allowed for writing down their placing, making notes for reasons, and returning the cards to Group Leaders. **PLEASE NOTE THAT REASONS WILL BEGIN AS SOON AFTER THE STOCKJUDGING AS POSSIBLE SO RECORD NOTES FOR REASONS IN THE 1 MINUTE TIME GIVEN AS ABOVE**. <u>REASONS WILL BE GIVEN BACK AT THE SHOW FIELD WHERE THE MAIN RALLY COMPETITIONS ARE TAKING PLACE</u>

#### **Rules:**

The top six teams gaining the highest number of points plus the top six individual gents and ladies, if not already included in the top six teams, shall be required to give reasons. *Mobile phones MUST be switched off during the stockjudging competition, failure to do so will lead to the competitor being disqualified from the competition.* Stockjudging cards must be fully and clearly completed by competitors or they will be discounted.

#### **Reasons:**

All competitors from each team will be required to do one set of reasons out of the following three classes:

Class 2: Dairy Class 4: Beef Class 6: Sheep

The top six teams and the top six individual males & top six individual females will be required to give reasons. Individual males and females can select one class from the possible three reasons classes.

#### Prizes:

A trophy will be presented to the winning team and in addition, merit certificates will be awarded. The top female competitor and the top male competitor, after giving reasons will be awarded merit certificates, regardless of whether they are members of the winning team. **Please note that an associate member cannot be awarded individual prizes.** 

#### **Points:**

# PRACTICAL COMPETITIONS

## Construction – Gate (10ft)

### Team:

One team per club consisting of two members

### **Competition:**

Team members are required to construct an item as detailed in the construction plan given on the morning of the Rally. All materials will be supplied, competitors must provide their own cordless drill which will be the ONLY power tool permitted. Each team will be responsible for tidying their site. Marks will be deducted if this is not done.

#### Time:

Beginning at 9:00am and ending at 12:00noon, extra time will be allowed for completion but 1 point will be deducted for every five minutes over time. Items **MUST** be finished.

The entry fee for this competition will be confirmed as soon as possible. The construction plan will be given out on the morning of the competition. Please ensure that all entered teams participate on the day (Entry fees will apply to all entered teams)

# Ropemaking:

#### Team:

Each District is permitted to enter six teams, the third and fourth of which must be an All Ladies Team, the fifth and sixth of which must be an ALL Junior Team. Each team to consist of three members

#### **Competition:**

Competitors must make a 3 ply, 6 strand rope using polypropylene MEDIUM twine. Finished length must be 15m with one end to be completed with a backsplice and the other with 100mm loop. Twine will be provided. Rope length to be measured ONLY AFTER SPLICING (before rolling up).

The ropemaking area will be cordoned off, measuring 25m x 25m approximately. Only the competing teams, the Judge, and Stewards are allowed within the area. Any team being in contact with their coach or spectators during their allocated time will be disqualified. One item of ropemaking machinery may be set up before the starting time and fixed to the ground if necessary.
