Scoring

The Valuation and Produce Section are classed as Club Competitions. Others are scored on an individual basis. A club will be awarded with one point for every competition that they enter.

The scoring for all competitions will be as follows:

1st – 10 points

2nd – 8 points

3rd – 6 points

 $4^{th} - 4$ points

 $5^{th} - 2$ points

In the event of a draw both teams will receive full points. Points will not be split between teams. E.g – two teams are joint third, they will both receive 6 points each.

Rules

Study the rules for each competition carefully. Note starting times – all competitors must register with the respective Convenor or Judge at the time stated on the schedule or they may be subject to disqualification.

- All competitors must be bona fide competitors of a Club affiliated to the East Region of SAYFC and must not have reached their 30th Birthday by the day of the Rally.
- Stewards must be notified of all changes in representatives before the competition commences.
- A Junior can be a Senior, but a Senior cannot compete as a Junior.
- No separate associate classes will be provided.
- If there is more than one competitor in a class, one member of the team may be an associate, unless otherwise stated.
- The Committee reserves the right to cancel or amend any of the Rules.
- In all competitions the judge's decision is final.

Maximum of one entry per club per item.

JUNIOR

Maximum of one entry per club per item.

All items must be delivered to the produce section between 10:30am – 11am, with judging commencing at 11.30am.

All sizes and recipes stipulated must be adhered to or they will be disqualified.

The judges will be asked to place the first six in each class – Junior and Senior.

Entries should be displayed on white paper plates, with sealed completed entry tags attached to the bottom. Entry tags will be provided upon registration.

No late items will be accepted.

Coronation Quiche Recipe

A deep quiche with a crisp, light pastry case and delicate flavours of Spinach, Broad Beans and fresh Tarragon. Eat hot or cold with a green salad and boiled new potatoes - perfect for a Coronation Big Lunch! x1 20cm Flan Tin

Serves 6

Ingredients

Pastry

- 125g plain flour
- Pinch of salt
- 25g cold butter, diced
- 25g lard
- 2 tablespoons milk
- Or 1 x 250g block of ready-made shortcrust pastry

Filling

- 125ml milk
- 175ml double cream
- 2 medium eggs
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh tarragon,
- Salt and pepper
- 100g grated cheddar cheese,
- 180g cooked spinach, lightly chopped
- 60g cooked broad beans or soya beans

Method

- 1. To make the pastry...
 - 1. Sieve the flour and salt into a bowl; add the fats and rub the mixture together using your finger tips until you get a sandy, breadcrumb like texture.
 - 2. Add the milk a little at a time and bring the ingredients together into a dough.
 - 3. Cover and allow to rest in the fridge for 30-45 minutes
- 2. Lightly flour the work surface and roll out the pastry to a circle a little larger than the top of the tin and approximately 5mm thick.
- 3. Line the tin with the pastry, taking care not to have any holes or the mixture could leak. Cover and rest for a further 30 minutes in the fridge.
- 4. Preheat the oven to 190°C.
- 5. Line the pastry case with greaseproof paper, add baking beans and bake blind for 15 minutes, before removing the greaseproof paper and baking beans.
- 6. Reduce the oven temperature to 160°C.
- 7. Beat together the milk, cream, eggs, herbs and seasoning.
- 8. Scatter 1/2 of the grated cheese in the blind-baked base, top with the chopped spinach and beans and herbs, then pour over the liquid mixture.
- 9. If required gently give the mixture a delicate stir to ensure the filling is evenly dispersed but be careful not to damage the pastry case.
- 10. Sprinkle over the remaining cheese. Place into the oven and bake for 20-25 minutes until set and lightly golden.

Knitted Blanket Pattern

Materials:

- 3 skeins of any yarn worsted weight (#4) yarn from the Knots of Love approved list of yarns.
- Needle size: US 9 (5.5mm)
- Yarn needle
- Scissors

Finished Size: 30" x 24"

Instructions:

CO 117 stitches

Pattern Notes:

For a smooth edge around the blanket, slip the first stitch knit-wise and purl the last stitch of every row. Do not include the edge stitch in the pattern count in all rows. After you work your edge stitch, follow the row pattern, starting with a knit or purl.

Pattern:

- American Moss Stitch. (Over an uneven number of stitches)
- Row 1: K1, *[p1, k1]; rep from * across.
- Row 2: P1, *[k1, p1]; rep from * across.
- Row 3: P1, *[k1, p1]; rep from * across.
- Row 4: K1, *[p1, k1]; rep from * across.
- Repeat rows 1–4 until the blanket measures at least 30 inches.
- Finishing: Weave in ends

TEAM STOCKJUDGING (all member attendees can take part in an individual stock judging)

11am 1 Team of 6 competitors (the team should include 1 junior and 1 female competitor)

Classes: 6 classes (5 minutes to judge each class and 1 minute to mark up)

EVENTS FROM 11.45am ONWARDS

STOCK JUDGING REASONS

11.45am 1 senior competitor

1 junior competitor

Class: Competitors will be required to give one set of reasons from a pre-selected stock judging class.

2 minutes will be allowed for reason giving. No competitor will be stopped, but competitors will be penalised at the rate of two marks for every complete ten seconds over the appointed time.

Total marks available: 50

(Separate junior and senior competition)

VALUATION

11.45am 1 team (the team should be made up of a minimum of 2 members and maximum of 3)

Classes: up to 25 items

One hour to complete the valuation of items. Farm sale values will be used. One score sheet

per team. Any competitors seen referring to notes or books will be disqualified from the

competition.

SHEEP HANDLING SYSTEM SET UP

11.45am 2 competitors (1 male + 1 female)

Class: Competitors will have to set up "Pratley" sheep handling system.

GRADING LAMBS

11.45am 1 competitor (male or female)

Class: Competitors will be required to grade the pen of lambs using the standard grading criteria.

IDENTIFICATION

11.45am 1 male competitor + 1 female competitor

Class: 20 items to be identified (10 agriculture & 10 household)

ATV DRIVING COURSE

11.45am 1 male competitor + 1 female competitor

Class: Competitors will be instructed to operate an ATV according to the judge's instructions.

Judging will be on time and skill, although penalty points may be incurred for failing to stay on

course. Points will also be deducted if helmet is not worn.
